

EASTEDS

A mediaeval hall house on a high stone base. The hall preserves a moulded bressumer (crossbeam/lintel) at the dais end and two arched doors to the screens passage. The entrance door to the hall is reached by an external stair case. The south front is weather boarded.

The house is thought to occupy the same site as the manor house for the Manor of Nutham which existed in circa 1349. By 1844 Easteds Farm belonged to the Eversfields of Denne, but by 1868 it had been re-united with the lordship of Nutham manor, the Hurst family.
