

NEWFOUNDOUT, Reeds Lane

The main house was built possibly in the sixteenth century and is a four-bay timber-framed house. At one time it was called "the Doins" and was run as a tea shop during World War I.

The old cottage next door, now demolished, was occupied in 1871 by the Lloyd family whose descendants still live nearby today.

The first references we can find to the Newfoundland name are shown on the 1875 maps. The area named thus is not shown on the censuses earlier than 1871. It was part of the Denne Estate owned by the Eversfield family.
