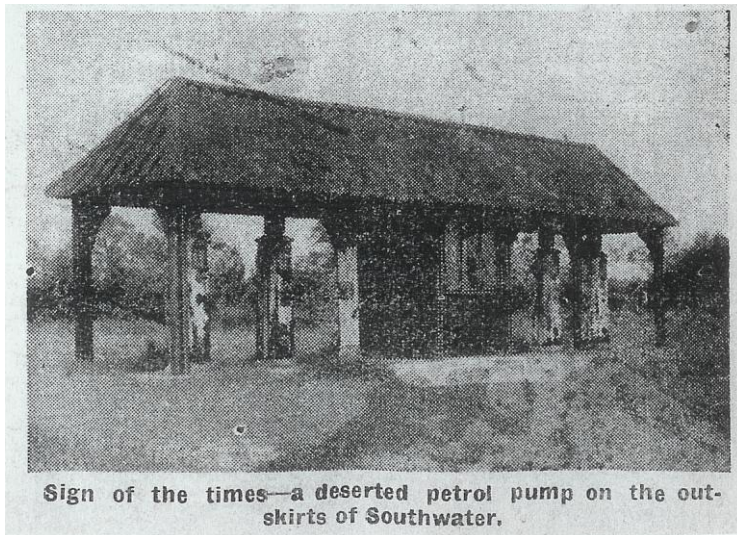


ROBIN HOOD, Worthing Road

Robin Hood was built to an architect design in 1936 as a restaurant and tea room. It was also intended to operate as a petrol-filling station, but petrol shortages during the war made that impossible. For many years afterwards, the petrol pumps remained standing near the roadside.
