

VICARAGE COTTAGE, Church Lane

We believe that this 17th century cottage was originally known as Worsfolds Farm. It was owned in 1785 by Sir Henry Fletcher and occupied by Edward Etheridge. In 1805 Thomas Kilner, farmer, was paying an annual rent of £ 15 and £ 3 tax on it.
